The locations in these counties are Mineral Point, Dodgeville, Ridgeway, Barneveld, Spring Green, Avoca, Argyle, Cobb, Linden, Montfort, Highland, Rewey, Hollandale, Blanchardville, Gratiot, South Wayne, Darlington, Shullsburg, Benton, Hazel Green, Cuba City, Platteville, Belmont, Fennimore, Muscoda and Arena. 
Point and our Bargain Nook Stores in Mineral Point and Darlington. The buses leave Hodan Community Services between 5:45 a.m. and 7:15 a.m. and start arriving at our Center about 8:40 a.m. The buses run their afternoon routes home between 3:05 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Our client-employees enjoy going to other activities and events out in the community with the Enrichment Activities and Shades of Silver Senior programs.

Trips include playing bingo, music at the Senior Center in Dodgeville, movies in Platteville, fishing at Yellowstone and Blackhawk Lake, shopping and lunch outings. We also provide medical trips and transport people to and from medical appointments and hospital visits. Transportation includes to local doctors/hospitals and to Madison area doctors/hospitals.

Our vehicle fleet includes one large bus, 6 regular size buses, 1 medium size bus, 2 mini buses and 1 mini-van. All of our vehicles have wheelchair lifts and securements. Diane Kliebenstein is our Director of Transportation, and Bob Pilling is our Assistant Director of Transportation. Diane and Bob both drive routes in addition to their

transportation management duties. Other regular drivers are Mark Chambers, Michael Fink, Becky Jones, Craig Nelson, Bill Pilling (assisted by his wife Jean), Tom Pilling, and Don Williams. The substitute bus drivers are Jerry Dolphin, Don Schultz, and Charlie Sigg.

Rich Weaver is the driver of our cargo truck that is also part of our vehicle fleet. The cargo truck transports contract production work for our Center's Production department from Cummins Emissions Solutions, Walnut Hollow, Shorr Packaging, Sielaff Corporation, New Farm, HyPro, and Brunkow Cheese, as well as transporting donated clothing and household items from Lands' End and Swiss Colony to our five Bargain Nook stores. There are also two vans that are used for travel to wholesale and retail shows to sell our Wisconsin Innovation Kitchen's Farmhouse Recipe products. •
